

2017 Fall Photography Tour of Japan

The Autumn season is my favorite time to visit Japan and I am excited about the opportunity to bring a small group to experience it in October 2017! The temperature is moderate, humidity is low, chances of rain are lower and the leaves of Japan are spectacular as they change colors! There are so many wonderful places to visit in Japan to see the Autumn leaves, but here are the places I plan on bringing you to:

11 Nights, 12 days

Oct 24th, Tokyo (1 Night)

Oct 25th - 26th, Kamikochi (2 Nights)

Oct 27th, Matsumoto (1 Night)

Oct 28th - 29th, Karuizawa (2 Nights)

Oct 30th - 31st, Kyoto (2 Nights)

Nov 1st - 2nd, Kawaguchiko (2 Nights)

Nov 3rd, Tokyo (1 Night)

The timing of the fall leaves changing colors isn't an exact science and we can't always count on mother nature to be on time, but the places we plan to visit will have fantastic photo opportunities even if we are a little early or late for the leaves. Also, I don't think it is enough to just visit Japan, but always like to include optional cultural experiences as well. These will be arranged depending on the preferences of the group but could be such experiences as cooking lessons in a Japanese home, tea ceremony, flower arrangement, traditional Japanese music/art, or something more along the lines of ninja/samurai experience or even visiting a master sword smith.

Another popular option is to have a portrait session with a real maiko/geiko (geiko is the commonly used term for geisha in Kyoto) while in Kyoto or some locals wearing Japanese traditional clothes like kimono or yukata. If you have other interests or requests, please let me know as it might be possible!

Intro & Highlights

The basic plan will be in the next section, but here is a little about each place we plan on visiting.

Tokyo | 1 night

If New York is the city that never sleeps, [Tokyo](#) is the city that doesn't even slow down! A truly unique megalopolis, full of energy, lights and more food experiences that you could hope to try. For a city of this size (greater Tokyo area is around 35 million), Tokyo is amazingly clean, safe, provides ample and on time public transportation. Except for some random or early trees, we will be too early for colors in Tokyo.



Kamikochi | 2 nights

Kamikochi is my favorite place in Japan that isn't a city. In addition to beautiful scenery, it often provides opportunities to photograph monkeys and other animals as well. Kamikochi doesn't allow private cars so it's best explored by foot on the easy walking trails. Like the timing of the leaves, of course I can't guarantee that you will see monkeys during your stay there, but I've had 100% success so far! The header image for this tour page is from Kamikochi. In an average year, we should have good timing for leaves in Kamikochi.



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Matsumoto | 1 night

On the way from Kamikochi to Karuizawa we will make a brief stop in Matsumoto, a quaint castle town in Central Japan. Matsumoto Castle is a National Treasure and the oldest standing castle in Japan, making for a great short stop along the way to our next location. While it's possible for some leaves, the main goal here is the castle.



Karuizawa | 2 nights

Karuizawa is a small upscale mountain resort town in central Japan. With nearby waterfalls and ponds, the Autumn colors should combine to provide wonderful photographic opportunities. The town itself is also quite pleasant to walk around and photograph. In an average year, we should have good timing for Autumn leaves.



Kyoto | 2 nights

[Kyoto](#) is my favorite city in Japan and perhaps the world. It has a wonderful mix of modern and traditional Japan with food that is just as rich as Kyoto's history. Truly a unique place! Highlights include some spectacular temples and shrines like the Golden Pavilion, Ryoanji, Nanzenji, Kokedera and Fushimi Inari Taisha. Also we will check out some of the historic areas of Kyoto like the Geiko District (Geisha in Kyoto are referred to as Geiko) of Gion, beautiful Higashiyama neighborhood and the relaxing Path of Philosophy. Except for some random or early trees, we will be too early for colors in Kyoto.



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Fuji Five Lakes | 2 nights

Perhaps Japan's most iconic symbol, Mt. Fuji is best seen from afar rather than climbing! Though the mountain has a reputation of being "shy" by hiding behind clouds, October - February offer the best percentage of days to see the mountain clearly. We will base our stay in the resort town on [Lake Kawaguchi](#) though will also stop by some of the other [five lakes searching](#) for spectacular views of the mountain, hopefully with fall leaves, which in an average year we should have good timing for some areas of elevation in the area.



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Tour Itinerary

Here is the basic itinerary for the 2017 Fall Photography Tour of Japan. Dates are where we are staying that night and B = breakfast included, D = dinner included.

Oct 24th, Tokyo | B

The group will meet in Tokyo on October 19th though if you wish to arrive early of course you can! You can fly into either Narita or Haneda airport. The plan for this first day will depend on everyone's flights, but in most cases we will start with something in the afternoon or welcome dinner.

Oct 25th - 26th, Kamikochi | B

After breakfast we will take an early, direct bus to Kamikochi to avoid multiple transfers via train and bus. We should arrive around lunch time so after dropping our bags at the hotel, we will grab lunch and then off to explore Kamikochi by foot. The following day we will e

Oct 27th, Matsumoto | B

No matter when you visit Japan, I believe spending time in Kyoto is a must! Again, I talked about Kyoto and said it was my favorite city (it's really awesome) so there is plenty to see here as well as day trips we can make. Of course you also know Kawaguchi san as well if you want to add him to this trip!

Oct 28th - 29th, Karuizawa | B

The transfer to Lake Kawaguchi isn't the most convenient as we will have to take a train and then a bus

but the views should be worth it! We will spend two nights here in a very relaxed atmosphere compared to the hustle and bustle of Kyoto and Tokyo and Mt. Fuji is sandwiched in-between for our trip. I'd highly recommend having a driver/guide for this area as public transportation is not convenient here.

Oct 30th - 31st, Kyoto | B

We will transfer to Tokyo after breakfast on the 10th by a direct bus. Both buses to and from Kawaguchiko aren't as comfortable as the train but both allow us to make the trip as efficiently as possible. We should arrive in Tokyo by lunch giving us almost 2 full days at the end of the trip in Tokyo, depending on your flight leaving on the 12th.

Nov 1st - Nov 2nd, Kawaguchiko | BD

We will transfer to Tokyo after breakfast on the 10th by a direct bus. Both buses to and from Kawaguchiko aren't as comfortable as the train but both allow us to make the trip as efficiently as possible. We should arrive in Tokyo by lunch giving us almost 2 full days at the end of the trip in Tokyo, depending on your flight leaving on the 12th.

Nov 3rd, Tokyo | B

We will transfer to Tokyo after breakfast on the 29th by a direct bus. Both buses to and from Kawaguchiko aren't as comfortable as the train but both allow us to make the trip as efficiently as possible. We should arrive in Tokyo by lunch giving us half a day to explore Tokyo together or you are welcome to some free time. Our tour official ends once we say goodbye for the day on the 29th.

Nov 4th | B

Of course you are welcome to stay as long as you want in Japan but if you are just sticking to the plan, October 30th is the day you should fly out of Tokyo. Either Narita or Haneda airport is okay.



Extension

There is currently no extension planned though please let me know if you are interested in one!



Accommodations

While Japanese accommodations are typically smaller than other countries, we will stay in a combination of Japanese Ryokans and "Western" style hotels, that will typically be 3 or 4 star accommodations. Japan is generally a very safe country, but certainly all of the places we will stay will be in safe locations as well as being convenient to our trip itinerary and being comfortable. Here are a few of the hotels I often reserve to give you an idea of the types of accommodations you can expect:

There are some areas of Japan where we will not be able to find hotels to stay in as nice as these or times when we may sacrifice slightly on luxury in order to spend more time sleeping (in other words, staying closer to our photography locations in Japan), but all accommodations will be clean, safe and comfortable enough to get good night's rest.



Investment

Fall Tour (11 nights) | \$6250 USD

Single Occupancy Fee | \$900 USD

Your investment per person, for this tour included:

- 3-4 star accommodations for 11 nights for two people per room. Single rooms are available for a supplement of \$900 USD and are due to availability.
- Services of your photo leader and other local guides when applicable.
- All transfers within Japan when we are together as a group, which will likely include a combination of bullet train (shinkansen), chartered transport or express highway bus.
- Breakfast on most days and some other meals indicated on the itinerary.
- Most temple, shrine and park fees are included unless there are some optional experiences you wish to take part in.

Your investment does not include:

- Airfare to/from Japan or any fees associated with your tickets. Japan Photo Guide does have a relationship with a travel agency in Japan and can help you with airfare, but this is completely optional. If making your own reservations, it is very important to contact Japan Photo Guide before doing so to make sure times will work with the group.
- Participants from from some countries may need a visa to visit Japan. Japan Photo Guide can help you with the process, but there may be additional costs.
- Any meals/activities/experiences during free time are not included and some of these while together are optional and are not included.
- While some meals will be included, often there are additional beverages that are not included like alcohol and sometimes soft drinks.
- All personal expenses are not included.
- Medical or travel insurance is not included.

Other Notes About Your Investment

These prices are in United States Dollars are based on a group of 6 or more participants. **If the group turns out to be 5 or less, there is small group fee of \$500 USD per person.**

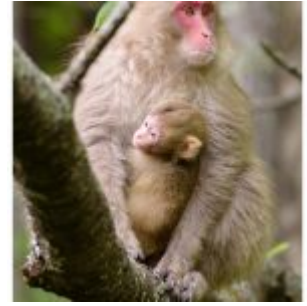

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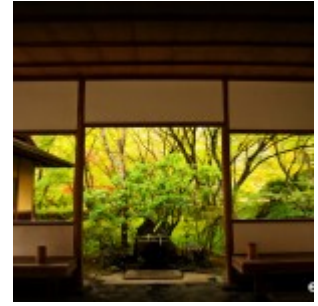




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Additional Notes

Earthquakes

Earthquakes occur daily in Japan but high majority of them are so small they are not felt. In most cases, buildings in Japan are built to strict regulations to withstand moderate earthquakes but of course no place is completely safe nor can we predict earthquakes. In the unlikely event that we experience an earthquake of significance, it is important to be familiar with safety procedures. Japan Photo Guide highly recommends searching the web for this information but [here is a good place to start your search](#).

Transit and Accommodations

All accommodations and hired transit (as well as public transit) will be clean, safe and hotels will have private bathrooms and showers. In general, Japan is a very safe and clean country, but still be mindful of valuables and your camera gear.

Health and Fitness

Please be aware that while we will not be taking place in any extreme workouts, there will be a considerable amount of walking and participants should be in good physical condition and health. Plan to have comfortable walking shoes as we will be walking not only a lot and on flat surfaces but also sometimes uphill/stairs.



Terms and Conditions

Insurance

Japan Photo Guide requires you to have health insurance that covers you while traveling. Travel insurance is strongly encouraged to help reduce risk of financial losses that could occur. Different restrictions and limitations apply to travel insurance so please contact your insurance provider of choice and read over the details of their policy carefully. Take into account factors such as weather, missed connections, unable to travel due to sickness, family emergency, injury, unexpected financial problems, airline strikes, or other personal issues.

Health Requirements

In most cases, tours in Japan require moderate activity levels but there will be a lot of walking. Additionally, you may find it difficult to adjust to multiple time zone changes depending on your country of origin. Waking up before sunrise for morning photography sessions also need to be taken into consideration as well as carrying your own photography equipment.

It is important to contact Japan Photo Guide before booking with any health or dietary concerns.

Most of the trip we will not be too far from hospitals or medical facilities, but there could be some days and time during transit where we are not within close range of immediate medical care.

Booking, Deposits, Cancellations and Refunds

Booking is available by first come first serve basis. To book a tour, you must submit the booking form and your deposit of \$800 USD per group. Your spot is not reserved until you have submitted a booking form for your party and deposit per person. When booking less than 4 months in advance, payment in full is necessary.

If you need to cancel, you must submit the cancellation form and agree to the following conditions:

100 Days or more | You can receive a refund minus a \$275 USD minimum cancellation fee per person plus any associated costs/fees (including credit card fees) charged by companies providing services, accommodations and experiences in Japan. Depending on the trip, fees could be in the amount of 25% to up to 100% of tour cost.

61 - 99 Days | You can receive a refund minus \$550 USD minimum cancellation fee per person plus any associated costs/fees (including credit card fees) charged by companies providing services, accommodations and experiences in Japan. Depending on the trip, fees could be in the amount of 25% to up to 100% of tour cost.

60 Days or less through end of trip | No refund.

Tour Plan and Potential Changes

Japan Photo Guide designs tours with specific plans and goals in mind to experience all Japan has to offer, but in some cases, changes may need to be made without advance warning. Such changes could include but not limited to, accommodations, sightseeing schedule and experiences. When these changes need to be

made, especially if weather is the factor for change, when possible, Japan Photo Guide will try to get input from the group when possible.

Model Photography Release

Japan Photo Guide reserves the right to use your picture, portrait, or photograph taken on tour in all forms and media and in all manners, including composite or distorted representations, for advertising, trade, or any other lawful purposes. Any photographs submitted to Japan Photo Guide also may be used online or printed for promotional use.

Note about the use of the word "Guide" in Japan Photo Guide:

I am not an official licensed guide in Japan or anywhere else! Japan has very strict guidelines on becoming an official guide. Basically there are 3 levels:

1. English Speaking Guide(ESG): Officially licensed guide. She/He can do guiding, escorting, interpreting and so on
2. English Speaking Escort(ESE): Non-Licensed. She/He can escort the group and give them the instruction or information but cannot provide the history, culture, tradition and so on.
3. English Speaking Assistant(ESA): Non-Licensed. She/He will just help boarding train or bus, or helping check-in etc.

I am number 2, ESE. This means that I cannot be paid to teach you about Japanese history, culture, traditions and so on. The "guide" in Japan Photo Guide is meant for photography guide, not guide of Japan. Any payment is not to hire me as an "English Speaking Guide" in Japan.
